In 2003, **CEC ArtsLink** collaborated with the Open World Leadership Center to bring to the United States the first group of young arts managers from Russia for an in-depth professional residency. Since then, managed by CEC ArtsLink, the program enabled over 270 Russian artists and cultural managers to travel to the U.S. to participate in premier professional gatherings around the country, engage with American counterparts and present work to American audiences. Each residency is designed to rely on the shared language of the arts to facilitate a mutually beneficial dialogue between Russian participants and their American hosts. Open World Cultural Leaders Program is supported by the **Open World Leadership Center** at the Library of Congress, the **National Endowment for the Arts**, and the **Renova Group of Companies**. CEC ArtsLink plays a dual role providing overall administrative support for the program as well as hosting a number of groups in partnership with leading arts organizations around the country.

- Participants are nominated by panels of Russian experts and selected in a competitive review process
- Program alumni continue to engage with colleagues in the U.S., receive awards in their fields, and develop international collaborative projects.
